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Preface

"One imperative for our collective success is in-country technical assistance. Countries require TA so that they can achieve their targets to prevent and treat AIDS, TB and malaria, with the help of finance from the Fund and others. This support must be sourced broadly:

Acknowledgements etc.

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This Guide is based primarily upon data submitted by TA-providing organizations. Aidspan assumes that these organizations were truthful in their submissions. Data provided by these organizations was when necessary translated into English, and was occasionally edited for space reasons or to improve clarity.

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Chapter 1: Introduction and Background

This Guide is intended to be useful to any country or organization that is considering applying to the Global Fund, or whose grant application has been approved by the Fund. It contains the first directory ever published of organizations and individuals that provide Global Fund-related technical assistance.

The Global Fund is a multi-billion-dollar international financing mechanism intended to help advance the fight against AIDS, tuberculosis and malaria by dramatically increasing the availability of funding for practical health initiatives. Funding is allocated to disease prevention, treatment, and care and support. Funded activities include both piloting of new and innovative programs and scaling up of existing interventions. The objective is to make it easier for affected countries to improve availability of health services, build national capacity, promote behavior change, conduct operational research, and gain access to critical health products, such as medicines to treat HIV, tuberculosis, and malaria.

With only a few exceptions, Global Fund grants are available only to programs designed and implemented by multi-sectoral partnerships in developing countries – partnerships defined and termed *Country Coordinating Mechanisms* (CCMs)¹. These partnerships can include government, non-government and community-based organizations, academic and educational organizations, people living with HIV, tuberculosis, or malaria and related patient and consumer groups, the private sector, faith-based organizations, and multilateral and bilateral development organizations.

During the past two years, the Global Fund has approved three 'rounds' of funding proposals. As of 31 December 2003, the Fund had committed a total of \$2.05 billion, of which it had disbursed \$232 million toward proposals approved in those first three rounds. And as of 9 January 2004, actual contributions into the Global Fund by all donors amounted to the \$2.10 billion.

The Need for Global Fund-related technical assistance

This Guide seeks to serve three sets of readers:

- (a) Countries and organizations that plan to apply to the Global Fund in the Fourth or later Round of funding, and that seek TA to assist them with preparing their application. (Round 4 was launched on 10 January 2004, and applications must be submitted to the Fund by 5 April 2004.)
- (b) Countries and organizations that were approved to receive a Global Fund grant in Round 1, 2 or 3, and that seek TA in implementing their grant.
- (c) "Global Fund-related TA providers" (that is, organizations and individuals that seek to provide TA to applicants for and recipients of Global Fund grants) that wish to be aware of and possibly share ideas with other TA providers.

During 2004, the Global Fund will approve Round 4 grants, and also begin approving renewals of Round 1 grants as these grants complete their second year. This will place a considerable financial burden on the Fund unless donor countries significantly increase their funding commitments.

Therefore Round 4 may be the last chance for some time for countries to submit new proposals. Although the Global Fund has awarded grants to more than 100 countries, many eligible countries have never received any funding from the Global Fund – either because they did not apply, or because their applications did not succeed. These include at least eight sub-Saharan African countries, at least five countries in Latin America and the Caribbean, at least five countries from among the Baltic states and the Balkans, and at least ten countries in Asia and the Pacific Islands.

Furthermore, between Round 2 and Round 3, there was an increase in the percentage of proposals deemed ineligible for funding by the Global Fund's Technical Review Panel (TRP), and an overall

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¹ Normally, the Fund only considers applications from CCMs. But occasionally it will consider applications from NGOs or from groups of NGOs – for instance, in countries where there is no functioning CCM, or in countries where the CCM does not tackle some necessary activity (such as working with drug users), or where a cross-border response is appropriate.

decrease in the amount of funding recommended per round, indicating a possible need for TA to boost both the quantity and quality of funding requests.²

More than 100 countries around the world have had grant proposals approved by the Board of the Global Fund. There are several steps between grant approval by the Global Fund Board and ultimate receipt of grant funds by the applicant. These steps include an evaluation by the TRP of the grantee's response to the TRP's questions about the proposal; an assessment of the intended Principal Recipient (PR) and of its plans; and final grant contract negotiations. The assessment of the Principal Recipient is extensive and, as outlined in a 150-page guidance document, includes assessment of institutional and programmatic capacity, financial and management systems, procurement and supply management ability, and capability for monitoring and evaluation. The effort to meet the high requirements of the Global Fund in these various areas is generating a significant demand for TA. (The forthcoming Aidspan Guide to Starting Implementation of a Global Fund, mentioned in the Preface above, is intended to provide assistance regarding these assessments.)

Forms of Global Fund-related technical assistance

Many types of organizations have already provided Global Fund-related TA to CCMs and other potential applicants in this process. These include:

- Multilateral agencies, such as WHO, UNDP, World Bank, ILO and UNAIDS.
- Bilateral development agencies, such as DFID, GTZ, USAID, the US CDC, and NORAD.
- In-country and international NGOs, from very large to very small.
- For-profit companies, including corporations contributing pro-bono resources, and corporations seeking to generate revenue from TA.
- Technically qualified individuals able to contribute expertise as volunteers or as paid staff and consultants.

"Global Fund-related TA" – a term used frequently in this Guide – includes all activities designed to assist CCMs, CCM member organizations, and non-CCM applicants to adequately meet Global Fund requirements. This definition can be further elaborated in three ways:

TA can vary according to what TA is provided, including:

- providing information tailored to the needs of the recipient
- providing skilled people short-term or permanent staffing, consultants, experts, researchers, and project managers
- providing funding to support TA-related people and activities
- providing equipment, supplies, and space to support TA-related people and activities.

TA can vary by when the TA is provided, including:

 pre-proposal TA, to provide strategic guidance about whether to apply to the Global Fund, how a proposal or its underlying project might be structured, organizing and facilitating CCMs, identifying and structuring main parties (such as Principal Recipient, sub-recipients, and technical partners), and helping with initial proposal preparation

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² Between Round 2 and Round 3, the percentage of eligible proposals recommended by the TRP went down from 43% to 39%, and the dollar value of the recommended proposals as a percentage of the dollar value of all eligible proposals went down from 41% to 34%. (See GFO Issue 13 at www.aidspan.org/gfo/archives/newsletter.) Contributory reasons might be that the countries most capable of submitting good applications had already done so; that these countries were not yet ready to submit applications for follow-up projects (or didn't realize that the Fund is very open to additional proposals being submitted long before earlier projects have been completed); and that some applicants simply didn't understand that the type of application they were submitting had almost no chance of being recommended by the TRP.

- proposal support, including help with writing and/or editing a Global Fund proposal that reflects technically sound program and budget plans, and that represents broad input from all the players represented on the country CCM.
- support after the Global Fund has approved the proposal, up to the point of final Global Fund grant negotiations and signature, to assist the CCM in responding to technical questions and to assist the CCM and Principal Recipient through the Principal Recipient assessment
- support once Global Fund grant funding is underway to help Principal Recipients, subrecipients, CCMs, and intended program beneficiaries and consumers to ensure adequate implementation, outcomes, and impact of funded programs.

Finally, TA can vary according to the specialized nature of assistance provided, including

- general assistance, such as:
 - support in sponsoring and organizing meetings, such as meetings of CCMs, proposal-writing teams, and technical expert teams,
 - support for general document writing, editing, translation and production.
 - support for developing linkages, partnerships, and working relationships, such as ensuring the involvement of NGOs or improving the participatory and inclusive functioning of CCMs.
- assistance that is specific to potential Global Fund grants for disease prevention, health promotion, treatment and care, and health products supply and management, including:
 - provision of supporting data, such as country-specific epidemiological and clinical information about HIV/AIDS, tuberculosis and malaria that supports design of programs against these diseases.
 - support in developing and conducting needs assessments and operational research to prepare for Global Fund applications.
 - support in program design, including design of new innovation or pilot projects, and also including design of scale-up programs and national adaptation of successful pilot projects.
 - program planning, including detailed systems analysis and operations planning.
 - Design and integration of monitoring and evaluation plans, and establishment of coordination and reporting mechanisms.
 - budget and accounting support, including detailed program costing, and establishment of financial disbursement and reporting mechanisms.

Research methods in developing this Guide

Aidspan researched and wrote this Guide during an eight-week period from early November 2003 to early January 2004, following the Global Fund board decision that Round 4 would be launched on 10 January 2004.

Aidspan's outreach and consultation for this report included five broad phases:

- In early to mid November, development of the project in consultation with a range of experts and advisors (noted in the Preface section of this report). During this period, it became clear that there was no pre-existing directory of TA providers from which meaningful data could be extracted, and that therefore the Guide would have to be compiled completely from scratch.
- In late November, distribution of information about a 15-question survey in four languages to the 4,500 people around the world who receive GFO. (See text in Appendix 5.) Most people who then accessed the survey did so at Aidspan's web site, but other methods were offered to those who do not have web access.

- In early December, communication with up to 10,000 additional people through the
 distribution lists of the Global Health Council, GTZ, the International AIDS Economics
 Network (IAEN), ICASO, the International HIV/AIDS Alliance, NMAC, and more.
- In mid-December, further outreach to TA providers based on an analysis of responses received by the original December 12 survey deadline.
- In early January, data confirmation with those who had responded to the survey.

Notwithstanding this outreach, Aidspan acknowledges that this Guide probably excludes a number of the following types of TA provider:

- Those providers without access to email during December 2003.
- Those who weren't on any of the distribution lists we used
- Those who operate in languages other than English, French, Spanish and Russian (the four languages used in the survey and the contact letter).
- Those who weren't ready as of December to declare their availability to provide TA.
- Those based in a single country who are already in contact with the CCM in that country and do not aspire to providing Fund-related TA in other countries.
- Those government agencies and other large TA providers whose decision-making processes were too slow to enable them to respond in time to the survey.

In cases where large organizations have operating units in multiple countries, Aidspan sometimes received responses from several of these units. Aidspan then sought and obtained agreement on a single listing to represent the entire global operations of each such organization.

Aidspan edited survey responses only for clarity and formatting purposes. Aidspan therefore makes no claims regarding the accuracy of each TA provider's claims and descriptions listed here.

As discussed in the Preface, Aidspan plans to publish an updated version of this Guide in February.

Chapter 2: An Overview of the TA providers Listed in this Guide

This Guide lists contact information and descriptive text regarding 170 Global Fund-related TA providers. Of these, 135 are organizations and 35 are technically-qualified individuals. Throughout this Guide, these have been organized into twelve categories, as follows:

Chapter 3: How to Use this Guide

Starting on page 97 are appendices that provide indexes of the 170 TA providers, listing them (a) alphabetically, (b) by global region in which they have provided Fund-related TA, (c) by country in which they are based, and (d) by language capacity.

Readers of this Guide who are seeking potential TA providers may wish to go through the following steps:

- Determine, arising from the discussion under "Forms of Global Fund-related technical assistance" in Chapter 1 above, the reasons why you seek a TA provider and what role you want the provider to play.
- Study all the listings in this Guide, to identify a shortlist of TA providers of interest to you.
- Conduct further research on these TA providers by studying their web sites, and, if possible, by getting advice about them from trusted experts and advisors.
- Contact the TA providers of interest by e-mail. In your e-mail, identify who you are and what your TA needs are. Let them know whether you are contacting just a few TA providers, or many. Then ask the TA provider questions such as the following:
 - Do you have TA experience and/or TA staff in my country and region?
 - Can you provide examples of your work that demonstrate your knowledge and experience related to our TA needs?
 - Have you previously conducted TA for Global Fund applicants or recipients? If so, who are they, and can you provide names of people who will serve as references? Can you provide names of other experts who will attest to the guality of your work?
 - Are you available for a TA project and/or partnership designed to meet our current needs? When would you be able to do the work?
 - Will you need payment? If so, on what terms? Might you be able to help us identify other partners who could pay for the TA costs?
 - Regardless of your availability and cost for a longer-term project, are you available at no charge in the short-term to help us define our TA needs and to clarify the terms of reference for a possible paid TA project?
 - If a TA partnership seems possible, how would be proceed? What would be the first steps? Would you be able to meet with us in person?
 - Who are all of the people available from your organization for TA; and for each of them, what is their expertise and accessibility (skills, experience, languages, availability, contact information, cost, ability to travel)?
 - When would we decide on a contract, and what are your contractual expectations?
